From the Principal

2017 NAPLAN Performance Overview

In Term 3, the school distributed 2017 NAPLAN reports to students in years 3 and 5. Generally, the results of individual students have matched their predicted performance, both from teacher judgements and other assessment tools, including NAPLAN. At a school level, however, our 2017 comparative results (when measured against 'like' schools) are disappointing. 'Like' schools are grouped together using the Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage (ICSEA). Although the results are not yet publically available, a copy of our comparative summary is included below.

It is important to note that NAPLAN is only one tool that the school uses to identify areas for improvement. All 2017 school data has been discussed with the board at our last two meetings. School staff have also analysed the results at a school, cohort and individual student level, to identify additional strategies that will be actioned in 2018. The school's current strategies in English and mathematics are endorsed by the Department of Education as 'best practice'. As a result, these will be maintained, but strengthened where necessary.


