

Semester 2 Reports

Semester 2 reports will be distributed electronically, by email, for the first time at our school on Wednesday 13 December. Please ensure your email address is accurate by checking with the school office. Paper copies are available upon request to the school office.

Electronic delivery of student reports provides advantages to schools and the parent community including: timely delivery of reports to parents and guardians;

- ◆ administrative savings in the printing and collation of reports;
- ◆ an ability to provide copies of reports to each parent or guardian where dictated by family circumstances; and parents being able to retain a digital record of student achievement.

◆ Learning Area Grade Reports can be collected from the school office from Wednesday afternoon if you would one.

The information contained in your child's report provides a summary of their achievement, effort, attitude, behaviour and progress in school this year. An area of interest for many parents is their child's academic achievement. This information is reported using grades in years 3-6 (A – E) or grade descriptions in Pre-primary to year 2 (excellent, high, satisfactory, limited, very low).

Your child's grade is determined using the West Australian Curriculum achievement standards. These standards describe the expected knowledge and skills for students who have been taught the curriculum content for the full year of schooling. For example, students performing above the expected standard will receive an A grade (excellent) or a B grade (high). Students demonstrating satisfactory achievement will be allocated a C grade (satisfactory). Students performing below the expected standard will receive a D grade (limited) or E grade (very low).

It is important that all aspects of your child's report are taken into consideration when considering their achievements, areas of strength and where further development is required. Parents should also be aware that children progress at different rates throughout their schooling. This can be reflected in their achievement grades. It is therefore not unusual for a child to fluctuate between different grades both within and across the years.

Information about the West Australian Curriculum, including year level achievement standards is available through the School Curriculum and Standards website.

School Board meeting report

As this was the last meeting of the year, there was quite a bit of time spent on the financial reports, which included the approval of the 2018 contributions and charges to families, the 2018 preliminary budget, as well as the letter outlining payments options for families. The board also completed the next module of the board training which is an ongoing focus of the board as we evolve.

We have approved the school in the sending of reminders to families regarding the voluntary contribution next year as we understand that it can be an issue to pay this at the same time as the purchasing of other school resources. This is not to put pressure on families but as a friendly reminder to those with good intentions who may have forgotten. On this note, If you cannot remember if you have paid your voluntary contribution and would like to pay it for this year, Please contact the Front office as they will be able to let you know.

With the movement of staff, increase of enrolments, and governmental policy changes the board was informed of preliminary staffing and classing that has been structured for next year. Like all things these are subject to change and will be released to the school community in the coming weeks.

A report on the Social emotional learning strategies working groups first meeting expressed the interest that we have in the community for this project and looks like this will be of great added value to the school.

We were also given an update and overview of this year's PEAC results and the ALPS program which is aimed to help our upper band students to achieve their best. One of the great successes seems to be the Year 6 Transition program, which has seen our students getting an extended "taste of high school" in the fields of Science and Digital Technologies. We hope that this gives them a smoother integration to their new environment next year and lessens any apprehension that they might have. Hopefully this relationship with the High school can continue in the coming years.
