



Good Standing Framework

Good Standing is underpinned by the following key principles of restorative practice:

- Positive interpersonal relationships are a major influence on behaviour.
- A culture of care supports all individuals in the school community.
- Cultural receptiveness and responsiveness is key to creating learning communities to mutual respect and inclusion.
- A restorative approach leads to individuals taking responsibility for their behaviour.

Good standing

All students commence with and retain good standing while exhibiting behaviours that align with the school's values and beliefs.

Loss of good standing

Loss of good standing occurs after a suspension or series of behaviours that are not aligned with the school student behaviour support guidelines.

Shared responsibility

In partnership with students, their parents/carers and the school community, we share expectations and responsibilities for student behaviour.

Social and Emotional Learning

Duncraig Primary School aims to support the physical, social, intellectual and emotional development of all students. Through the use of range of evidence-based framework, programs and strategies, Duncraig Primary School provides a safe, inclusive and caring learning environment where belonging and connectedness are paramount.

The period of time is determined by the nature of the reason for losing Good Standing.</p> <p>The period of time will be determined by such factors as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Age of the student • Intent of the student • Disability/Capacity of the student • Events prior to the loss of Good Standing <p>Good Standing can only be removed by Principal/Deputy Principals; and the length of time without Good Standing will be determined at the point of time where Good Standing is lost.</p> <p><u>How does someone lose Good Standing:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Not following school rules • Not following our whole school values program • Being a bystander and not taking action to assist others • Not being inclusive of others • Hurting another student (physically or emotionally) • Ongoing 'mean' behaviour (bullying) towards another student • Demonstrating unsafe and disrespectful online behaviours • Not demonstrating fair play • Not making good choices
